# 's Church of England Primary School



## General Background Information

Carleton St Hilda's Church of England Primary School is a Voluntary Aided Primary School within the Diocese of Blackburn and caters for children between the ages of 4 – 11. The school accommodates approximately 210 children. The number of children admitted in each year group cannot exceed 30.

The earliest official records show that the school originated in 1680 and was the first school in Poulton-le-Fylde. The present building is situated within the village of Carleton on the outskirts of Poulton-le-Fylde and the school moved to this site in 1967. The building is well cared for, is in an excellent state of repair and supports work of high quality.

Internally it is aesthetically attractive and intellectually stimulating with displays of children's work making a clear statement about our high standards. There is a large school hall which we use for Worship, PE/Games activities, Dance and Drama activities. We also use the hall as a dining area at lunch times and to provide our Breakfast Club and After School Club.

Outdoor facilities include two hard play areas – one for Foundation Stage and Key Stage One children and one for Key Stage Two children. There is also a large school playing field which is used for a wide variety of sports activities and an enclosed outdoor area for children within our Foundation Stage. We love to see children learning outside and make extensive use of our grounds including our outdoor classroom, conservation area, and willow dome.



# Our Mission Statement

At Carleton St Hilda's we have a distinctive Christian ethos & character which permeates all aspects of the curriculum and school life.

## Admissions Policy

### *Making an application*

Applications for admission to the school for September 2017 should be made on line on the common application form and submitted to the Local Authority by 15th January 2017. Parents who wish their application to this Church school to be considered against the faith criteria should also complete the supplementary form. If the school is over-subscribed, a failure to complete the supplementary form may result in your application for a place in this school being considered against lower criteria as the Governing Body will have no information upon which to assess the worship attendance.

The supplementary form must be downloaded from the admissions website and then posted to school as a hard copy.

Letters informing parents of whether or not their child has been allocated a place will be sent out by the local authority in April 2017.

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# Pre School Programme

During the summer term, the school provides a pre school programme for the children who start school in the following September. The children are welcomed in to school several afternoons to meet the staff and to familiarise themselves with the school buildings, routines and equipment. A Parents Information Evening is also held in the summer term outlining details of induction arrangements into school for the children in September. In addition, parents are also offered a home visit, usually by the class teacher and teaching assistant. This has proved beneficial in easing the child's transition from home to school.



## Our Curriculum

At St Hilda's we feel that it is very important for our children to enjoy the curriculum and to foster a love of education and learning.

In order that every child may reach his/her full potential we provide an exciting curriculum which is broad, balanced and creative, allowing for a progression of skills in line with the national curriculum requirements.

We aim to make good use of our outdoor area and school grounds as well as our wider local area.

Visitors are invited to our school to help develop the children's learning and to teach and inspire them.

### *The Early Years Curriculum*

In their first year in school, the Reception children follow the Foundation Stage curriculum. A rich variety of activities and experiences are provided for the children throughout the different areas of learning both inside the classroom and also within our Early Years Foundation Stage outdoor area.

### *Key Stage One and Key Stage Two*

Children will access a rich, creative curriculum to inspire and challenge all learners and prepare them for the future.

Cross curricular topics enable children to develop skills while making real life, meaningful links and engaging with the wider community.



## English

Our aim is to extend children's ability, confidence and enjoyment of English so that they can communicate effectively. This is achieved through a balanced programme of speaking, listening, reading and writing. Each child takes part in a daily, structured and progressive English lesson in addition to developing their English skills in other curriculum areas.

## Mathematics

We place great importance on Mathematics and we hope that your child will develop both an understanding and a love of the subject. Each child takes part in a daily, structured Maths lesson which incorporates direct teaching and interactive oral work, both within the whole class and with groups. The children are guided through a programme of practical and written activities to ensure that they not only know and understand the essential elements of the subject but can also apply their knowledge with confidence and enjoyment to the world around them.

## Foundation Subjects

In Science, we aim to encourage all children to explore and investigate the world around them.

Equipping children for tomorrow's world by teaching them Computing skills is another essential part of our curriculum. Computing is taught both as a discrete subject and also through other curriculum areas across the school.

Other subjects such as Geography and History are taught using a themed approach in each class.

## Music

Music is taught in all classes throughout the school and we seek to develop the children's composing, performing and listening skills. Children have opportunities to learn a range of musical instruments from peripatetic teachers. In Year 3 the children learn to play the recorder as part of their music curriculum.

## Sport and Physical Education

In Physical Education (PE) we aim to promote the development and progression of skills in gymnastics, dance, games, athletics and outdoor activities. Children are encouraged to value physical exercise for health reasons and to develop team spirit, cooperation and leadership skills.

All children have swimming lessons during their time at our school. They are taught by a specialist swimming teacher alongside the school staff.

The school also has specialist coaches from outside school to deliver particular aspects of PE to the children. We also work with the Wyre and Fylde Schools Sports Partnership to offer other sporting activities together with Fleetwood Town Football Club.

## School Dinners

School dinners are cooked on the premises and a cafeteria system allows the children a choice of menu. The meals provide a balanced nutritional diet with choices of salads, fruit, yoghurt etc.

## Packed Lunches

Children are able to bring a packed lunch from home but we ask that drinks should be provided either in a plastic container or carton.

# Uniform

The school has a uniform which we believe encourages and promotes pride in the school and prevents discrimination. All children are expected to wear uniform.

## All Children:

- Green V-neck jumper/cardigan with gold trim and school logo (available from the school office)
- White shirt/blouse
- Grey tailored trouser/grey skirt/pinafore
- Green & gold tie (available from the school office)
- Green & white gingham check dress for girls in the summer
- Grey or white socks/grey tights
- Black school shoes (not trainers or canvas shoes)

Please mark all clothing with your child's name.

## PE

For PE and activity lessons children need to change into an appropriate set of clothes. White T Shirt with no logos on, green shorts, plimsolls.

T shirts and shorts are available from the school office. School fleeces are also available from the school office.

The wearing of jewellery is discouraged in school for safety and security reasons and the school is unable to accept responsibility for lost items. Earrings and studs for pierced ears are considered unsuitable for PE and swimming and must therefore be removed.



## Parents' Evenings

We have two formal Parent's Evenings a year which are usually held in October and February/March time. Parents are allocated a ten minute appointment time and this is an opportunity for you to talk individually to the teacher about your child and their progress. In February the children receive a Mid Year Report outlining children's attainment in line with national expectations as well as effort in each of the key areas.

In the Summer Term all children receive a written report in July with progress comments on all National Curriculum subjects. This report will include results of National Curriculum Assessments if your child is in Year Two or Year Six. There is an opportunity for you to come into school to speak to the teacher about the report if you need further information.



## Homework

There is a homework policy available on request. The quantity and frequency of homework increases as the children move through school. This work will cover such areas as:

- Learning spellings and multiplication tables
- Reading
- Extension/consolidation work
- Research work

We feel that it is of vital importance that children should read at home on a regular basis - DAILY IN MOST CASES - and we recommend parents spend time reading with their children in a quiet relaxed atmosphere. A home/school reading programme is in operation and further information and advice on how you can help your child is always available from class teachers.

Children in their final year at school will be set more specific homework tasks as they prepare for their end of year tests and also to establish valuable learning habits for their time at High School.

Staff appreciate parent's support in ensuring that homework is completed and returned to school on the correct day. If you have any queries about your child's homework, please do not hesitate to contact the class teacher to discuss this.

## Inclusion

At St Hilda's we are committed to meeting the needs of all our pupils in an inclusive and positive environment.

We believe that all children are entitled to a broad and balanced curriculum and ensure that all our children take part in a wide range of activities.

Working in partnership with parents we aim to quickly identify and reduce any barriers to learning and participation, including those that may be caused by a child's special educational need or disability.





# Special Educational Needs

At Carleton St Hilda's Special Educational Needs (SEN) is a priority and we work hard to ensure that all children are making progress according to their own abilities.

We have various programmes and procedures in place to ensure children are supported appropriately in their learning.

At times, outside agencies may need to be consulted in order to obtain specialised information and guidance. These may include the school nurse or doctor, educational welfare officer, speech therapist or the educational psychologist. We work closely with both parents and other experts to meet the needs of individual children.

There is a school governor who has responsibility for overseeing special needs. Our school Inclusion Manager is Mrs M Barrow and she is always available to discuss any concerns or issues.

## Access

We have an accessibility plan to ensure school provides physical, social and curriculum access to all pupils, including pupils with disabilities. This is in response to the Disability Planning Duties 2002.

We have parking facilities for the disabled on our school car park and the school building itself has disabled toilet facilities available. The school is all on ground level allowing access for everyone and our grass and tarmac play areas are accessible to all.

Future plans to enhance accessibility are in place and will be implemented when building improvements are made or if the need arises unexpectedly.





## Safeguarding and Child Protection

As schools have daily, close contact with children, it is possible to observe signs of possible abuse, failure to thrive, or particular changes in a child's behaviour.

Parents should be aware that, where it appears to a member of staff that a child may be at risk or have been a victim of abuse of any form, the school is required by law under the Child Protection Procedures to report their concerns to Social Services immediately without contacting the child's parents.

Mrs Wareing is the designated member of staff for Child Protection.



## Data Protection

The school is responsible for managing its own budget to pay staff salaries, repairs, fuel costs, materials and books etc. To assist in the storage of large amounts of financial information and details about children we use a computer system for administration purposes. The Data Protection Act covers all the information stored on the school's computer.

# Child Safety

Your child's safety, whilst in our care at school is always paramount.

No unauthorised person other than the known parent(s), guardian(s) of a child will be permitted access to your child during school hours.

Do please let school know if any person/relative is not allowed contact with your child, so that appropriate action may be taken. You will always be informed if anyone approaches school regarding your child.

We ask you to collect your child from school if they are to be absent for a medical appointment.

If parents are late/detained at the end of the school day, please contact school as soon as possible. Children wait at the school office, in safety, until contact can be made with the parent and appropriate arrangements are agreed.

Although we welcome parents and visitors into school, security is important. All outer doors are fitted with secure closures and the entrance to school, during the school day, is through the main front door (again, through a security system.) All visitors must report to the secretary or Headteacher before entering school, to be signed onto the premises and issued with a security badge.

Any unknown person on the school premises during the school day will be challenged by any member of staff and asked for verification of identity. If identity is not clearly verified, appropriate action will be taken, involving the police if necessary.

We see our school as an open, welcoming school, but trust that parents will feel reassured and see the reasoning behind apparent restricted access to pupils.



## PTFA

The school has an active PTFA who organise several events each year to raise money for school funds. Activities and events include:

## Road Safety

The safety of all children is paramount at Carleton St Hilda's and our school actively supports the development of a sensible and positive attitude to road usage.

All of our Foundation Stage and Key Stage One children take part in the Right Start Child Pedestrian Training Programme, Stage One, Two and Three each year.

Our older children have the opportunity to take a Bikeability Course to give them confidence to ride cycles safely.

## Car Parking

Traffic congestion on Bispham Road is a serious problem, especially at the beginning and end of the school day and when school events take place.

It is recommended that children and parents walk to school, if this is possible, to ease the congestion.

If it is necessary to travel to school in a car, then the access to school must always be kept clear for deliveries and emergency access. Parents are asked not to park on the school zig zag lines outside of school or to stop on the yellow lines when dropping children off or collecting at the end of the school day. It is also requested that consideration is given to the residents who live on Bispham Road and surrounding roads by not blocking driveways. Additional parking is available on the Castle Gardens Pub car park.

As the safety of your children is paramount to us, it is requested that parents **DO NOT** use the school car park before and after school as this becomes heavily overcrowded and hazardous.



## Medicine in School

It should not be necessary to send medicines to school. If a course of antibiotics has to be completed and the child is well enough to come to school, then a responsible adult may come to administer the medicine during the day.

If your child requires medicines that do need to be kept in school, please complete the appropriate Medical Form available from the school office. These must be given to the designated person, usually the class teacher. A copy of the school's medical policy is available by request.



## Pastoral Care & Behaviour

Our school operates a positive approach to managing behaviour and discipline.

Very occasionally children may be at risk of harming themselves or others around them. If this situation arises we will move other children away for safety reasons. If we feel a child is at risk from harming themselves staff will take steps to intervene. We will always have the child's best interests at heart.

A copy of this policy is available on request in school.



## Attendance and Punctuality

Regular attendance and punctuality are expected at all times. Regular attendance and punctuality helps your child to learn, make progress, maintain friendships and to take full advantage of the opportunities available to them. It is the duty of all parents to ensure that children attend school unless they are ill.

Taking holidays in term time will affect your child's schooling as much as any other absence and we expect parents to help us by not taking children away in school time.

All applications for leave of absence must be made in advance using the "Request for Leave of Absence Form" available from the school office. Please note that holidays in term time will not be authorised by the Headteacher. The Local Authority Policy of issuing penalty notices may also be used as the school has adopted the Local Authority Attendance Policy.

## Before and After School Care

The school operates Breakfast Club and After-school Care provision on the site. Parents are encouraged to take advantage of this facility. This is available during term-time each weekday, from

7.30am – 8.50am and

3-30pm until 6.00pm

A session fee is charged for this facility, although it is a non-profit making venture and costs are kept low. The children are given many different opportunities to play and join in activities.

Carleton Childcare situated within the school grounds also offer holiday care arrangements. Close links are established with Carleton Childcare as part of our pre school liaison and induction.



## Complaints Procedure

If you have a concern about anything we do you can tell us by telephone, in person or in writing. If any of these are difficult for you, a friend or adviser can speak to us on your behalf. Most concerns or complaints will be sorted out quickly either by putting things right or by explaining the School's actions to you.

Try to go to the member of staff involved or your child's class teacher who will either deal with your issue or pass you on to someone who is more able to help.

If you have already told us about a concern but are not satisfied with how we have responded, you may wish to make a complaint.

We have a complaints procedure, please contact the school office.

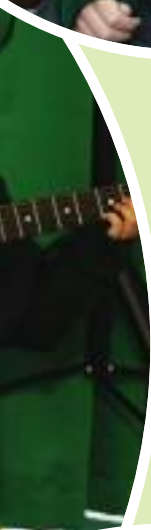
